A MAJOR * EARTHQUAKE WILL STRIKE HILLTOP AT 10:00 AM SEPTEMBER 12. BY BILL POPE



Hilltop's Emergency Response Organization (HERO), Inc. will be conducting practice rescue operations the morning of September 12 before Hilltop's Annual Block Party Picnic. Some homes will be decorated to simulate damage. There will be white rope hanging across a road to simulate a fallen power line. There will be water in a street to simulate a ruptured water main. These are all simulations. DO NOT REPORT these to Emergency Services (911) or to City Services (311).

See HERO in action between 10:00 AM and Noon. Our Command Center will be on Grand View at Indianapolis. You will see how we assess damages in the neighborhood, plan our response, communicate when phones are out, cordon-off hazardous areas, rescue people in distress, and evaluate and treat those who will be injured.

When the Big One strikes, HERO will need volunteers to drive trucks and vans to transport rescue equipment to incident sites, and casualties to our Treatment Area. Visit our Command Center on Saturday Sept. 12 to join the fun and gain some valuable experience.

Want to join HERO? Attend one of our one-night refresher classes for your preferred Team to see how we train.

Classes start at 7:00 PM at 3277 Inglewood Boulevard (see photos of past training sessions at www.HilltopHERO.org):

Tuesday, Sept. 8 Wednesday, Sept. 9 Thursday, Sept. 10 Damage Survey Team. Requirements: Able to look, walk and knock on doors. Search & Rescue Team. Requirements: Able to lift and carry 60 lbs for 60 feet. Medical (First Aid) Team. Requirements: Non-hemophobic.

In a real earthquake, remember to Drop, Cover and Hold on. Then do the B.A.S.I.C.S.

Basic life saving intervention for those:

Burning - Smother flames with fire extinguisher, blanket, coat, jacket, rug, or by rolling victim.

Buried - Remove debris and weight from victim's face and chest.

Bleeding - Stop rapid bleeding by direct pressure, elevation, pressure point. Use belt or tie as tourniquet if necessary.

Not Breathing - Look at chest, Listen at mouth, Feel at diaphragm for breathing. If not, open Airway via Jaw Thrust.

Airway. Keep the airway of an unconscious person open by placing them in HAINES (High Arm In Neck Exposes Spine) position.

Size-up. (At home or business, do lap around outside.)

lf:

(S)

- Pungent Gas Odor (Do not touch electric switches),
- Fire, Smoke, or Crackling sound,
- Moderate Damage (fractured walls) or
- Heavy Damage (tilting, off foundation, any collapse),

THEN:

- Evacuate all mobile occupants,
- Shut off electricity, small breakers, then main.
- Shut off gas at meter.

• Suppress any small fires if you can do so safely. OTHERWISE continue in place.

• Spinal injury Check – If victim cannot move or feel either fingers or toes, do not move casualty unless in harm's way.

Immobilize any large broken bones to prevent further injury before moving a casualty. Stabilize spine with ironing board/ door.

- Carry immobile casualties out of harm's way using a 6-person Lift, 2-person carry, 1-person blanket or clothes drag.
- Severity of injury? Check victim's RPM's (RespirationRate > 30/min, Perfusion > 2 sec. or Mental status not OK = Severe).

BEPREPARED! BY BY WAYNE BURKLUND

Every month that passes, we are a month closer to "The Big One", so it behooves us all to be as well prepared as possible. That means have at least a week's supply of food and water, and the food probably should be something that could be eaten cold if necessary. Naturally, the food and water should be rotated to keep it within the expiration dates. Of course, it could always be years or decades away, but we will have no warning. If you do not have at least two fire extinguishers, and an earthquake gas shut-off valve it is very important to get them. In the huge disasters like the San Francisco earthquake, the losses from cascading fires were something like five times the losses from the shaking.

A home gas or propane generator is also a good thing to have, so that you could keep a fridge running and have minimal electricity; and is essential if anyone in your home is on a dialysis machine.

DID YOU KNOW? SOME SANTA MONICA AIRPORT HISTORY





The Santa Monica Airport is the oldest continuously operating airport in Los Angeles County since 1917.

Our Army trains at Clover Field. Clover Field was named in honor of Lieut. Greayer Clover, son of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel T. Clover of L.A.



Douglas Aircraft Co. moved to Santa Monica in 1922 and established a factory on Wilshire Blvd. to manufacture military aircraft. Within two years, Douglas aircraft flew on the first "round the world flight",which attracted some 50,000 spectators to Clover Field.



The day after our country's entry into WWII, the Federal Government leased the airfield from the city. The runway was constructed, and air traffic control facilities and hangars were added. To protect Douglas from bombing, a mock factory was built on the golf course side, while an all-out manufacturing effort began on the north side. The newer propane generators are far superior to gasoline since propane is much easier and safer to store and has no expiration or deterioration with age. Older gas generators can be converted to propane fairly easy. HNA has a secure data base of emergency contacts for those of you that have provided that information. Even if land line and cell circuits are out, there may be some possibility for us to make contact for you via our ham radio network.

You might want to re-read the "Neighbors Helping Neighbors" article from the last beacon, since its far nicer to stay with a neighbor than in the FEMA or Red Cross or National Guard Shelters, if your home should be "red tagged" due to severe damage.
